Ndungane Construction is a dynamic company that delivers civil engineering construction projects throughout South Africa with a focus on building a reputation for delivering quality products and services.

Jointly owned by Odwa Ndungane and Musa Dlamini, the company was established in 2015 as an independent entity in which the Teichmann Group has a minority stake. Ndungane Construction has followed in the footsteps of Teichmann by taking the name of one its directors, successful South African Springbok rugby wing, Odwa Ndungane, to create personal accountability throughout the company.

In 2017 the association with the Teichmann Group was strengthened through a Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment partnership, which saw Ndungane Construction acquire a 25% stake in Teichmann Structures.

Teichmann Structures operates throughout South Africa, predominantly in the civil construction, structural steel, rehabilitation and geotechnical disciplines. Over the past two years the company has experienced phenomenal growth.

By working with Teichmann Structures, Ndungane Construction has been able to augment their civil engineering skills, particularly among the previously disadvantaged, as well as leverage opportunities to deliver professional civil engineering construction projects throughout South Africa.



PROJECT ACHIEVEMENTS

At the end of 2016, Ndungane was awarded three separate contracts at BMW's Rosslyn plant in Tshwane, which formed part of the award-winning BMW HEMS Roof Lift project. The contracts, with a combined total of R1,74 million, involved the manufacture and installation of pre-cast beams as part of the new structural steel roof project, the demolition of building B10,5 and the construction of a dual carriageway dyno pit.

The following year the company showcased its ability to work in the demanding mining environment, under strict timelines, when it undertook a R31 million contract to construct a 7,2km coal conveyor as part of the Mafube Coal Mine Life Extension Project near Middelburg.


The new conveyor was a key requirement so that mining operations could continue. With the scope comprising of both bulk earthworks and civil construction, work consisted of seven work faces distributed across the 7,2km conveyor. Successful completion of the contract has earned Ndungane a reputation of being a contractor that will exceed all expectations to deliver client satisfaction.

In June 2017 the company was awarded a 12-month contract to the value of R27,5 million for a modular plant expansion and project handling facility at Sishen Mine in the Northern Cape. The scope comprised bulk earthworks, including the removal of old foundations and soil improvements, excavations and various reinforced concrete structures.

Another 12-month contract was awarded in May 2018 to the value of R8,974 million to load and haul blast material to the primary crusher and honey hole stockpile at Lafarge Ridgeview Quarry in Durban.

Ndungane also executes smaller contracts such as road infrastructure work which has already been completed in KwaMashu, Durban. The scope of work included bulk excavations, layerworks, kerbing and channelling, premix surfacing, sidewalks and gabion installations. This was needed to improve road infrastructure on Ibunda, Inyoka and Isiqwayi roads.

Another small contract is the construction of a balancing tank in Port Elizabeth as part of Nooitgedaagt Coega Low Level Scheme Phase 3. Work commenced in November 2017 and included layerworks and concrete works that formed the water retaining structure.
